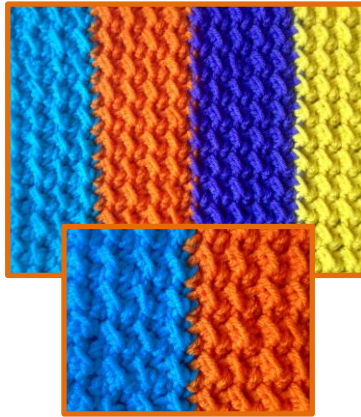


Dorothy's* Weave



Supplies Needed: Crochet hook size K and one skein of washable yarn (or five colors of leftover yarn to make a blanket as pictured above).

To begin - CH 45-50, depending on the thickness of the yarn and your stitch gauge. Chain should measure approximately 20" from start to hook.

Row 1 – SC in second CH from hook and across to the end.

Row 2 – CH 1, turn, *SL in next stitch, HDC in next stitch*, repeat between * across to end of row.

Row 3+ – Same as row 2 until you reach finished size. Be sure to note the last type of stitch you did in each row, so that when you CH1 and turn, you do the opposite stitch (ie. if you finished a row with a HDC, the next row should start with a SL, and vice versa!).

Final Row – When you've reached the final size, do one last row of SC across to balance the piece.

Border – Any type of border can be applied to this piece, from a simple SC to something more elaborate. To duplicate the blanket pictured, simply SC in each stitch along the perimeter, putting three SC in each corner. For the final border row, use the same stitch pattern used throughout the blanket (alternating SLs and HDCs). This makes an interesting, curvy border!

Key:

CH – chain

SC – single crochet

SL - slip stitch

HDC - half double crochet
