

CFC Temperature Blanket

This is a super-easy blanket that you can do with whatever crochet stitch you'd like or hook size. It'll be a fun way to look back and see how cold, hot, or varied the weather was during the month. Here are some basic directions, based on how I'll be doing mine. It should result in a blanket that's approximately 20"x20" (but as always, anything remotely close is fine!). *Feel free to be creative!*

- * Hook size: K (6.5mm)
- * Yarn: 4-ply washable
- * Stitch: HDC
(half-double crochet)
- * Gauge: 10 stitches = 4"

- **Directions:** Chain 50, turn, complete a HDC in the second chain from hook and in every chain across to the end.
- Create one row each day, which reflects the temperature outside (according to the thermometer). I plan to use different shades of the colors as I go, just to make it more colorful (all my rows will likely be blue or purple!)
- At the end of each row, make your final HDC into the top of the stitch, and you're done for the day. Each day you'll then attach a new color (if needed), chain 2 and turn to complete the row for the day!
