Who we are ...

Comfort for Critters ships free, handmade pet blankets to animal shelters across the US. We're a social entrepreneurship that raises funds to "keep going and keep shipping" by selling books packed with easy crochet patterns and information on the animal sheltering industry. If you don't have your own way of crafting blankets, our books help you make blankets to donate to shelters, or to comfort your own pet!

All net proceeds go to ship our free handmade blankets to 400+ animal shelters in every US state! These blankets are made by our amazing group of volunteers, who come from all parts of the US.

While homeless pets await adoption, the blankets provide a comfortable bed year-round. When they are adopted, their blanket goes with them, providing something familiar as they adjust to their forever family.

We happily support all animals which may end up in shelters, including cats, dogs, guinea pigs, rabbits, fancy rats, fennec foxes, ferrets and more! Together we're making a difference to animal shelters & homeless pets!

As of 12/31/2023 we have donated over 181,000 free blankets to animal shelters!

Meet Anna...



Anna, pictured above, was adopted from the DuPage Animal Shelter in Wheaton, IL, and inspired her new mom to start "Comfort for Critters" in 2007 to help all the pets she couldn't adopt that day.

Why blankets?

An animal's life can be challenging when they find themselves in an animal shelter. Despite heroic efforts by the staff and volunteers, it's extremely stressful as they lose their home, are moved from cage to cage, and are subjected to new sights and sounds on a daily basis.

Having something to call their own, which provides warmth year-round (even against A/C in the summer), familiar smells and a soft touch, can make all the difference.

Once the animal is adopted, this comfort object is a cushion against the (wonderful) stress of getting to know their new surroundings and forever family. Once again, their blanket provides something comforting and familiar!

4 Ways you can help...

#1 Make a blanket – it's fun!

Just **knit or crochet** a blanket using any pattern and any color of washable yarn. Feel free to mix and match colors, and create your own pattern. You can also make blankets using **fleece** material (two pieces sewn or tied together) or create **mini-quilts**. The finished blanket should be approximately 20-22" square, but that's just a general guideline. The shelters help all sorts of pets, so they will accept blankets in all sorts of sizes!

#2 Donate materials – even leftovers!

If you don't have the time or expertise, but do have some extra 4-ply yarn or fleece material, we can put it to good use. **Any amount of washable 4-ply yarn, any color, would be appreciated.** All material is provided free of charge to local volunteers. Every bit is used to create beautiful blankets for homeless pets.

#3 Help keep us "in business"!

We rely solely on the generosity of animal lovers to help us ship our free blankets to animal shelters across the US. CFC's founder is the author of two books (shown at right) packed with 30 pet blanket crochet patterns, along with related industry information. They can be purchased at the CFC website, or on Amazon. Every purchase "helps us keep going and keep shipping"!

Getting your blankets to a shelter ...

We try to make it easy on our volunteers! Just follow these quick steps...

- Locate your closest participating shelter using our website (look under "Shelters Supported"). Click on the link to the shelter to get their full address and hours of operation. Be sure to mark your blankets to the contact name's attention!
- Drop off your blankets during the shelter's hours, or any time outside their front door (there's people there, even if they're "closed"). You may also mail your creations to the shelter, at your convenience. Use the enclosed "Drop-off Memo" (bottom half of page 5) when you donate your blankets so that they know they're part of the CFC program. This will ensure that the blankets are sent home when the pet is adopted.
- Send me an email (or fill out our website form) with the number of blankets and the name of the shelter you chose. I keep track of what every shelter receives, so that I know what to ship from headquarters and can guide other volunteers.
- Local volunteers can drop off blankets to me! CFC began in the suburbs of Chicago, so we have many local volunteers. They are welcome to drop off their blankets to CFC headquarters in Glen Ellyn, IL (the complete address is on page 5) and we'll send them out to a shelter in need. Any contribution towards shipping costs is greatly appreciated!

FAQs...

What's the best size for blankets?

We suggest 20-22" square since this will fit the most shelter enclosures and is appropriate for the greatest variety of pets. However, the shelters help pets in all sorts of sizes, so ANY SIZE blanket will be appreciated and used!

If you're near our headquarters in Glen Ellyn, IL you can drop them off any time. Please leave your name and email address with the items. Use the link to get the shelter's address. **Be sure to let me know, using our website form – thank you!**

How do I donate yarn or fleece?

We only accept donated yarn and fleece at our address in Glen Ellyn, IL. These materials are provided free of charge, 24/7, to all local volunteers.
